Damien has a great team of young, energetic and likeminded Supporters Workers who are trained in empower Damien to do things for himself via a "CANdo" framework that supports Damien organise himself to get up and shower, making breakfast, cleaning up and making his bed.



Gone are the days of restrictive practices. Damien's front door remained unlocked during the day, granting him the freedom to come and go as he pleased. This newfound sense of security and autonomy brought a sense of joy and liberation to Damien's life.

One of Damien's greatest joys was cooking meals alongside his Support Worker or Sister. With a flair for culinary creativity, Damien took charge of the kitchen, whipping up delectable dishes like Salmon Poke Bowl,



San Choi Bow, and Pasta Bolognese. Cooking became more than just a chore; it became a source of connection and joy, creating cherished memories shared with loved ones.

Simple pleasures like grocery shopping took on new significance for Damien. Armed with his shopping list, Damien ventured to the supermarket across the road, relishing the opportunity to tick off each item independently. In his previous living situation, such ordinary tasks were often out of reach, making each trip to the store a celebration of newfound freedom and independence.

Damien's family, and stakeholders worked closely to create a comprehensive project plan and timeline, ensuring a smooth transition to his new apartment.
